Transfer Experiences

- These activities can have a sorting component but largely promote the use of different sorts of tools that support hand and finger strength, left to right movement, focus, & concentration.
- Dishes with some kind of hard or soft object such as pompoms, beans or beads and tools such as various kinds and sizes of tongs, tweezers, spoons, chopsticks, and eye droppers with colored water, etc.









Pincer Grip

- Add children's names, letters or numbers to the




 Transferring tiny clothespins (from dollar store or Michaels)
